- The wardens are voluntarily extending their services without honorarium in a way to facilitate the students with boarding for nine months apart from donations received from the College staff, retired staff and public.
- Environmental consciousness measures are being practiced by using LPG instead of fire wood.
- A healthy educational environment was created to encourage students of hostel to participate in social service activities like Maanavata programmes, field work, plantation, formation of approach road to hostel, catering etc.,
